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REPORT OF NATIONAL NATURE CAMPING PROGRAMME

Introduction:

‘Nurture the nature for our future’ – with this motto, the students are given a chance to visit Wild life sanctuary or National park under the support of Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change. It provides a firsthand experience to the students and it makes them aware of the rising need of preserving nature and conserving natural resources. Eco clubs and Nature Camps being organized by the institutions enable to serve this purpose well.

Residential environmental education camps provide a setting that can result in beneficial changes in participants' self-esteem, interpersonal relationships, and feelings of connection with the natural world, as well as stimulating greater interest in future low-impact recreation experiences in natural areas. When students learn how ecosystems function and about environmental action strategies that contribute to their maintenance, they develop more environmentally responsible behaviours.

Background:

Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate change sanctioned the proposal submitted by Kerala State Council for Science, Technology and Environment for organising National Nature Camping Programme 2025 and released an amount of 16 lakhs for the programme.

The “Nature experience” to children and teachers has huge potential to trigger the sensitivity towards nature appreciation and conservation, leading to positive environmental actions at different levels.

The programme aims to conduct Field Visits (Nature Camps) in different protected areas/ Nature parks/Tiger Reserves of the State for 3 days to create awareness amongst school students on environment and nature. The programme aims to provide students an opportunity to learn about natural resources, ecosystem services and the importance of the area by involving them in activities such as:

Apna Paryavaran Janiye” (Know your Environment) by preparing small checklist of

- ✓ flora and fauna seen/spotted by them in the nature trail
- ✓ Bird watching
- ✓ Trekking
- ✓ Green Pledges
- ✓ Group Discussion involving record/sharing of experiences
- ✓ Other nature based activities

Objective

The primary goal of the NNCP is to create awareness about the environment, biodiversity and the importance of conservation by taking students on field visits to protected areas such as National Parks, Wildlife Sanctuaries, and other protected zones. These camps are designed to offer hands-on exposure to nature and foster a deep understanding of environmental issues.

Target Audience

NGC Students: The programme specifically targets students involved in the National Green Corps (NGC), which is a government initiative aimed at involving school children in environmental conservation activities.

Duration

The camps are organized for duration of **3 days** providing a balance of structured learning and real-world exposure to the natural environment.

Formulation & Conduct of the Programme

KSCSTE proposed to conduct the programme in association with District Implementation Committee of NGC and Forest Department. The programme aims to conduct field visits for NGC students in different protected areas/National parks/wildlife sanctuaries for 2-3 days to create awareness among school students on Environment and Nature. A maximum of Rs 1 lakh/camp @ Rs.2000/- each for student which includes coordination by KSCSTE and expenses incurred towards coordinating the programme for 3 days with a ceiling of 50 students/camp along with 5 teachers/ coordinators is the sanctioned allocation from Ministry.

KSCSTE organised the programme with NGC District coordinators as Conveners of the programme. Financial assistance released to the District Coordinators for organising the programme in the districts.

KSCSTE released financial assistance for organising 14 Nature Camps in the 14 districts of the State. All the districts organized the Camps before March 2025 and submitted reports, audited SE/UC and other documents.

NNCP TRIVANDRUM

Campsite: Neyyar Wildlife Sanctuary

Date: 26/12/2025 – 28/12/2025

The National Nature Camping Programme was jointly organized by the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change (MoEF&CC), Government of India, Kerala State Council for Science, Technology & Environment (KSCSTE), and the Environment Education Programme (EEP), Thiruvananthapuram District. The three-day residential camp was conducted at Neyyar Wildlife Sanctuary from 26th to 28th December 2025 with the objective of creating environmental awareness and promoting nature conservation among school students.

Objectives of the Programme

- To sensitize students about biodiversity and wildlife conservation
- To provide experiential learning through direct exposure to forest ecosystems
- To promote environmental responsibility and sustainable living practices
- To develop scientific temper and observation skills among students

Programme Highlights

- Orientation session on the importance of wildlife conservation
- Nature trails and biodiversity observation inside the sanctuary
- Sessions on forest ecology, flora and fauna, and ecosystem services
- Interactive classes conducted by resource persons and forest officials
- Group activities, discussions, and environmental games
- Awareness sessions on climate change, conservation ethics, and sustainable practices

The three-day Nature Camp conducted at **Neyyar Wildlife Sanctuary** was successfully completed with enthusiastic participation from students and dedicated support from the organizing and supporting agencies. The programme was effectively coordinated by

MoEF&CC, KSCSTE and EEP, Thiruvananthapuram District, in collaboration with the Forest Department.

Through guided treks, expert interactions, and hands-on nature study sessions, the camp successfully achieved its objectives of enhancing **environmental awareness**, **ecological understanding**, and **responsible attitudes toward biodiversity conservation** among students. The immersive experience helped foster a deeper emotional and intellectual connection with nature, while also promoting teamwork, discipline, and environmental stewardship.

Overall, the camp proved to be a meaningful and impactful educational initiative, leaving participants motivated to adopt eco-friendly practices and contribute actively to environmental conservation efforts in the future.



NNCP KOLLAM

Campsite: Shendurenay wild life sanctuary, Thenmala

Date: 06/01/2026 – 08/01/2026

A 3-day nature study camp was organized by the National Green Army, Kollam District, from January 6 to 8, 2026, at the Eco-Tourism Center in Thenmala Shentharuni Wildlife Sanctuary. As per the instructions given to the eco-clubs of the district, 50 children, 4 teachers and the district coordinator from 25 schools participated in it. The children ranged from Azhikkal School in the north-western border area of the district to Idathara School near Punalur in the eastern area.

On 06.01.2026, the bus started from Ochira at 11.00 am and reached Thenmala at 3.30 pm, carrying children from various centers via Karunagappally, Chavara, Kollam, Kottarakkara and Punalur. The camp was inaugurated at 4.30 pm by Eco Tourism Manager Shri Arun Prakash in a meeting chaired by District Coordinator Shri Reginald. Resource members Shri T.K. Sajeev, Shri K.V. Ramesh, Mrs. Latasha and Mrs. Ajeena Anto attended the meeting. Then Shri Arun Prakash conducted classes on the need and importance of eco tourism. He explained about the Shentharuni Wildlife Sanctuary and Thenmala Eco Tourism, the first planned eco tourism center in India. He also explained to the children about the following 4 important zones, and said that they would visit all of them in the coming days.

1. Adventure Zone (Elevated Walkway)
2. Leisure Zone (Relationship between man and nature)
3. Cultural Zone (Deer Rehabilitation Centre)
4. Botony Zone (Butterfly Safari)



NNCP PATHANAMTHITTA

Campsite: Thenmala Eco Tourism

Date:10/01/2026-12/01/2026

Nature Camping provides students with immersive hands on environmental education, fostering a deeper understanding of bio-diversities, sustainable practices and cultural preservation. It encourages responsible travel habits, unique hands on experiences, and awareness on climate

change and promote sustainable, local communities. It also increases their motor skills like climbing, balancing and Improve their learning skills.

Day 1

We started off to Thenmala Eco-Tourism Centre from Thiruvalla town at 11 am with 44 Students and 6 Teachers covering a distance 94 kilometers. Out of the 50 Children registered for the Nature camp 6 Students were unable to attend the program due to various reasons. All the Children were insured in United India Insurance Company Ltd under coverage C. The Children belong to 12 schools in Pathanamthitta District.

Our conveyance was Amala Travels Pathanamthitta. We reached Thenmala Eco-Tourism Center by 4.pm. After reaching, the Children took rest in their Dormitory- Bee Hive AC Dormitory. By 6 pm after Tea and Snacks we went out to see the Check Dam in Kallada River and the Observation point. Children have learned the significance of Check Dam in enhancing the natural flow of a river especially in Irrigation Projects.

Day 2

Visit to the leisure zone: It is a peaceful area featuring a hanging bridge made of wooden planks and sculpture garden. Students were very eager to walk on the hanging bridge. These hanging bridges test balance strength and courage. They also serve as significant team building tools fostering trust and overcoming fear. For the students it was a new and thrilling experience and they have enjoyed a lot. The moment they reached the leisure zone, their first priority was walking over the hanging bridge.

Sculpture garden: The students also visited sculpture garden highlighting man and nature with 23 diverse artistic installations.

Aquarium: The public aquarium at Thenmala Eco Tourism managed by Matsyafed features around 50 natural tanks displaying various fresh water and Marine fish species. Many of the species the students have seen it for the first time in their life. It was really an educational look at Aquatic life.

By 4 pm they went out to see the Thenmala Dam, which produces hydroelectricity in Kallada River. Students have learned how a dam works and seen how hydro Electricity is generated. By 6 pm they have returned from the Dam site and have evening refreshments.

Musical Dancing Fountain: By 7 pm they went to see the musical fountain, an incredible 30 minute evening light and sound show. They had dinner by 9.30pm and they all went to bed. On and Off the children attended lecture classes also

Day-3

Bird Watching: Children have woke up by 6 am and after their morning tea they set off for Bird Watching. It is said to be that visitors can spot over 267 Bird's species during bird watching activities. They have learned the different processes in Bird watching activity.

Guided Trekking: After breakfast they went out to experience the adventure zone and guided trekking. Students have enjoyed elevated canopy walk very much. It helps to overcome fear and help building confidence and self-esteem. Children have enjoyed watching spotted Sambar and Barking Deer.

By 1:30 children have lunch and by 2 pm they had valedictory function, in which the children have shared their experience of the program and expressed their gratitude to the staff in the center. By 3 pm children have bid farewell to the Eco-Tourist center Thenmala.



NNCP ALAPPUZHA

Campsite: Shendurenay Wild Life Sanctuary, Thenmala

Date: 05/12/2025– 07/12/2025

The National Nature Camping Programme was successfully organized at the Thenmala Ecotourism Centre, Thenmala, Kollam District, from 5th December 2025 to 7th December 2025 (three days) with the support of the Kerala State Council for Science, Technology and Environment (KSCSTE) and the Forest and Ecotourism Department.

Information regarding the programme was disseminated to schools across Alappuzha district through our network of teachers and school contacts. In response, schools nominated interested students for participation in the camp. From the nominations received, participants were selected based on priority criteria and ensuring equitable representation from all four educational districts of Alappuzha Revenue District.

A total of 50 students were selected for the camp, comprising 27 boys and 23 girls. The programme ensured participation from students representing diverse geographical regions and educational districts within the revenue district.

Overall, 55 participants attended the camp, including 50 students, 2 lady escort teachers, 2 male teachers, and 1 National Green Corps (NGC) official serving as the District Coordinator.

The three-day camp provided participants with valuable opportunities to experience nature firsthand and to learn about biodiversity, wildlife conservation, forest ecosystems, and environmental protection. Through various educational and experiential activities conducted in collaboration with the Forest and Ecotourism Department, students gained greater awareness of ecological issues and developed a deeper appreciation for the importance of conserving natural resources.

The programme concluded successfully, achieving its objective of promoting environmental awareness, nature conservation values, and scientific understanding among the student participants.

NNCP KOTTAYAM

Campsite: Mithra Nikethan, Vagamon

Date: 20/02/2026 – 22/02/2026

Three-day Nature Camp was conducted from 20th February to 22nd February 2026 at the famous hill station Vagamon in Kottayam District. A total of 50 students from various NGC schools participated in the camp. *(The list of participants is attached with this report.)*

On 20th February at 1:00 PM, the students and escorting teachers assembled at St. Mary's H.S., Manarcad, and the journey commenced in two special buses. By 3:00 PM, the group reached Mithraniketan, Vagamon. After evening tea, the students went for sightseeing, where they were captivated by the scenic beauty of the hills and forests. They prepared a checklist of *flora and fauna* and recorded their observations in the notebooks provided.

After dinner at 8:00 PM, the participants assembled at Mithraniketan for an Ice-Breaking Programme. During this session, students introduced themselves and developed a sense of camaraderie. Sri. Hari Kailasam introduced various methods of group formation. The programme concluded at 9:00 PM, followed by the distribution of T-shirts, cloth bags, books, and pens.

On 21st February, at 6:00 AM, the students and teachers proceeded for trekking at Murugan Mala, where they enjoyed the natural beauty of the hills. This was followed by a bird-watching session.

In the afternoon at 2:00 PM, the participants reassembled at Mithraniketan. Mr. Natesan P. R., Headmaster, GUPS Vaikom, conducted a class on environmental conservation. At 5:00 PM, Sri. Hari Kailasam conducted a session on origami techniques and paper carry bag making. In the evening, a campfire was organized, during which students presented various cultural programmes and took green pledges promoting environmental responsibility.

On 22nd February at 6:00 AM, the group visited Mottakkunnu, where they enjoyed the panoramic hill views. At 10:00 AM, they visited the Orchidarium and the origin point of the Meenachil River. Later, they visited the Pine Forest. The camp concluded with the return journey, and the group reached Kottayam at 4:00 PM.



NNCP IDUKKI

Campsite: Classic Eco Study Centre Chempakappara

Date: 30/10/2025 – 01/11/2025

A three-day National Nature Camping Programme (NNCP) was successfully conducted from 30 October to 1 November 2025 at Classic Eco Study Centre, Chempakappara, with the support of KSCSTE. The camp commenced on the evening of 30 October and concluded on the afternoon of 1 November 2025.

A total of 51 students and teachers had registered for the programme, out of which 45 students and 6 teachers participated in the camp. The campsite had accommodation facilities for up to 75 participants and provided a comfortable and nature-friendly environment for learning and recreation.

The programme began with a simple inaugural function. The camp was inaugurated by Rev. Fr. Mathew D. Paul from Arunachal Pradesh. In his inaugural address, he highlighted the geographical diversity of India and explained the unique features of dense forests, deserts, mountains, valleys, major rivers, plateaus, river basins, climate change, and global warming. His inspiring talk encouraged the participants to appreciate and conserve nature.

Following the inauguration, an ice-breaking session was conducted by DRP Smt. Jessy Sunny. The students actively participated in the activities, which helped them interact freely and build friendships. After refreshments, the participants visited a nearby grassland and were introduced to the objectives and activities of the camp. A self-introduction session enabled campers to become acquainted with one another.

The camp offered a variety of outdoor and experiential learning activities. Major attractions included trekking, mountain visits, bird watching, nature meditation, spending time in a tree house, rock climbing, visits to a medicinal garden, and exploration of a pine forest. These activities provided participants with direct exposure to natural ecosystems and enhanced their understanding of biodiversity and environmental conservation.

Several important environmental topics were discussed during the camp, including the significance of nature camps, biodiversity conservation, the Amazon River and Amazon Rainforest, water conservation, water, air and plastic pollution, and the relationship between students and nature. The resource persons and facilitators included Mr. Sebastian Vadakkemuri, who shared his valuable experiences from spending three years in the Amazon Forest, along with Mr. Tomy K. and Mr. Suresh Kumar.

Each session was followed by evaluation and assessment activities to ensure active learning and participation. Campers were also given opportunities to learn yoga, martial arts, soft skills, public speaking, and stage confidence-building techniques. Cultural programmes and entertainment activities added enthusiasm and enjoyment to the camp experience.

A memorable campfire programme was organized on the second night, where students and teachers actively participated in cultural performances and group activities. Daily diary writing and

presentation sessions encouraged reflection, observation, and communication skills among the participants.

During the two days of intensive interaction and learning, students and teachers developed strong bonds of friendship and cooperation. The participants were provided with nutritious and delicious food throughout the camp.

The programme concluded with a valedictory function during which all participants received certificates, prizes, and travel allowance. The campers and teachers unanimously expressed their gratitude to KSCSTE and the District Coordinator for organizing such a meaningful and memorable National Nature Camping Programme. The camp successfully achieved its objective of fostering environmental awareness, scientific temperament, leadership qualities, and a deeper appreciation for nature among the participants.



NNCP ERNAKULAM

Campsite : Thattekad bird sanctuary Kothamangalam

Dates of the programme: 05/12/2025 to 07/12/2025

A Nature Exploration Camp was organized at Thattekad Bird Sanctuary from 5th December to 7th December 2025. The camp witnessed the enthusiastic participation of students and teachers who began their journey from Aluva via Perumbavoor.

The trip commenced at 11:30 AM on 5th December 2025, and the group reached the sanctuary by 4:30 PM. After a short refreshment break, the programme was inaugurated by the Chief Wildlife Warden, C. T. Ouseph, with a brief address and presentation, followed by an informative video session.

On the next day, the programme began early with a Yoga session from 5:45 AM to 6:45 AM, which concluded with Pranayama and Surya Namaskaram. After a short rest, the participants, accompanied by a guide, went for bird watching, gaining first-hand experience in identifying various bird species.

Following a delicious breakfast, the group proceeded for trekking, which continued until the afternoon. Lunch was served at 1:00 PM. At 3:00 PM, an engaging session on nature conservation was conducted by resource persons Mr. Sivadas T. T. and Ms. Nisha P. A.

After a tea break at 4:00 PM, the participants visited the butterfly garden and the Salim Ali Bird Interpretation Centre. Here, students learned about different bird species, including their feeding habits and flight adaptations, which enriched their understanding of biodiversity.

The day concluded with an experience-sharing session, followed by a vibrant cultural programme where students showcased their talents.

On the final day, the programme began with a short morning Yoga session and bird watching along the Salim Ali Bird Trail. After lunch at 2:00 PM, a valedictory session was held, during which certificates were distributed by the Forest Range Warden. The camp officially concluded at 4:00 PM.

Overall, the camp provided a valuable opportunity for students to connect with nature, enhance their knowledge of wildlife, and develop a sense of environmental responsibility.



NNCP THRISSUR

Campsite: Chavakkad green Habitate Turtle beach

Date: 14/11/2025 – 16/11/ 2025

As part of the Nature Study Camp organized in Thrissur District, participants visited several ecologically and environmentally significant locations, providing them with valuable opportunities for experiential learning and environmental observation.

The camp included visits to the coastal rocky ecosystems of Chavakkad Beach, Oram Angadi, the Turtle Hatchery Centre, bird habitats along the banks of Chetuva Kayal and Kole wetlands, the Elephant Fort at Guruvayur, the Cattle Farm at Manathala, and the Mural Study Centre at Guruvayur. These field visits enabled students to gain first-hand knowledge of various ecosystems, biodiversity conservation practices, wildlife management, wetland ecology, and sustainable agricultural systems.

Special attention was given to understanding nature conservation initiatives in the region. The participants learned about the ecological importance of mangosteen gardens and the role of associated farmlands in conserving biodiversity and maintaining environmental balance. The visits helped students appreciate the interconnectedness of natural and human-managed ecosystems.

In addition to the field activities, expert-led sessions were conducted at the camp accommodation centre. These classes covered various environmental topics and promoted scientific thinking, environmental awareness, and conservation ethics among the participants. The interactive discussions and observations helped students develop a deeper understanding of ecological issues and the need for sustainable resource management.

Overall, the camp successfully provided participants with practical exposure to diverse ecosystems and conservation efforts while fostering scientific awareness and environmental responsibility among the students.





NNCP PALAKKAD

Campsite: Aashrayam Orchards, Nenmeni Kollengode, Parambikulam Nature Education centre
Date: 01/01/2026 – 03/01/2026

The National Green Corps (NGC), Palakkad, organized a Nature Camp with the support of the Parambikulam Tiger Reserve authorities, in which 53 selected students along with 7 teachers and parent representatives participated, gaining first-hand exposure to forests, wildlife, and diverse ecosystems; participants were chosen based on their active involvement in school- and district-level NGC programmes. The camp was inaugurated by Sri Nithish Kumar, IFS, and commenced at Aashrayam Orchards in the Nemmara Forest Division, located in the buffer zone of Parambikulam Tiger Reserve, where students engaged in a nature walk to Naripparakkunnu, observed wildlife, and reflected on human impacts such as forest burning. Activities included eco-meditation led by Sri S. Guruvayurappan, distribution of kits, and sessions on wildlife and human–wildlife interaction. On the second day, participants travelled via Anamalai Tiger Reserve to Parambikulam, where they undertook trekking with forest officials and tribal guides, observed wildlife and indirect evidence of animals, and learned about biodiversity and conservation at the Interpretation Centre; they also visited Kannimara Teak, major dams, and interacted with the Kadar tribal community. An interactive session by Sri Nithish Kumar further enriched their understanding. The third day included nature walks, biodiversity identification, yoga, and creative feedback presentations, followed by a quiz competition and prize distribution. Overall, the camp successfully promoted experiential learning, environmental awareness, and a strong sense of responsibility towards nature conservation among participants.





NNCP MALAPPURAM 1

Campsite: Karimpuzha Wildlife Sanctuary

Date: 24/10/2025- 26/10/2025

The National Green Corps (NGC), under the Kerala State Council for Science, Technology and Environment (KSCSTE), successfully organized a three-day Nature Study Camp at the Nilambur Karimpuzha Technical Centre with the objective of promoting environmental awareness and nature

conservation among students. The camp brought together student representatives from 45 selected schools across the district and provided them with an opportunity to experience forest life closely and develop a deeper connection with nature.

The formal inauguration of the programme was conducted by Nilambur Range Forest Officer Mujeeb Rahman. The function was presided over by District Coordinator Hamidali O. During the inaugural session, the Forest Officer emphasized the importance of conserving forests and biodiversity. The camp included a variety of educational sessions, field studies, and nature observation activities that enriched the students' understanding of the environment.

A major highlight of the camp was the bird watching session led by eminent ornithologist Umar Lakshadweep. Students were introduced to different bird species, their habitats, and observation techniques using binoculars. Butterfly observation training was conducted by Beat Forest Officer Riyas P., who explained butterfly diversity, life cycles, and ecological importance during guided forest walks.

Special sessions on the Western Ghats, night sky observation, biodiversity, and the relationship between environment and human society were also organized. Hameedali Mash and Abdurahiman A. led interactive discussions on environmental conservation, sustainable lifestyles, and the ecological significance of forests. Students actively participated in outdoor learning activities and group discussions conducted in natural surroundings.

The camp also included practical sessions on energy conservation and first aid training. Sabir P. from the Energy Management Centre (EMC) conducted awareness classes on energy efficiency and sustainable living. Students were also trained in basic first aid techniques, including CPR and emergency response methods. The three-day residential study camp organized by the Malappuram District National Green Corps (NGC) concluded at the foothills of Nilambur Nedumkayam, amidst dense forests, cool breezes, and the crystal-clear waters of the Karimpuzha river. Under the theme 'Return to Nature,' the camp was conducted with the collaboration of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change and the Kerala State Council for Science, Technology, and Environment. Beyond being a typical excursion, this camp served as a pilgrimage that

fundamentally transformed the environmental consciousness and perspectives of the participating students. Staying within the lush forest canopy of Nedumkayam, the journey provided a rare opportunity to read nature like a living textbook.

About 50 enthusiastic students, selected from various parts of the district, participated in this camp. Organized with the goal of nurturing a generation that loves and protects the forest and nature, these three days instilled a deep conviction in the students about eco-friendly lifestyles and ecological balance.

The official inauguration of the camp was performed by the Northern Circle Chief Conservator of Forests (CCF), Shri. Vijayanandan IFS. The ceremony was presided over by NGC District Coordinator Hamidali O., and Joint Coordinator Abdurahiman A. delivered the welcome address. Following this, in the keynote speech, Nilambur North Division DFO Shri. P. Danesh Kumar IFS spoke about the scientific aspects of forest management and its contemporary relevance.

1- Bird Watching

Before the first rays of the sun touched the treetops of Nedumkayam, the students set out on a journey into the world of birds. Led by Forest Officer Ameen Drambikkal, this session helped students identify birds not just by their colors, but by recognizing their unique calls. It was a novel experience for the students to use binoculars to closely observe birds perched high in the forest canopy. They were taught about avian anatomy, the specific shapes of beaks, and their diverse foraging habits.

2- River Walking & Trekking

The journey through the heart of Nedumkayam and its pristine rivers was the most exhilarating session of the camp. Led by NGC District Coordinator Hamidali O., students walked through the riverbeds to learn about the origins of forest streams and how forests act as sponges, storing rainwater to feed our rivers. By experiencing the scent and silence of the forest during this walk, students gained a profound understanding of the unbreakable bond between the river and the woods.

3- Plant Identification

The session led by Abdurahiman A. taught the students that every plant and tree around us is a vital link in the great chain of nature. He explained the scientific methods to identify indigenous trees of the Western Ghats and rare medicinal plants. Students practiced categorizing plants by observing leaf shapes, flowers, and fruits. Through this session, they became convinced of the vital importance of every tree in maintaining ecological equilibrium.

4- Meditation & Mindfulness

Sabir P. led a meditation session that reminded students that environmental protection is not just an external activity but something that must bloom within the mind. Meditating amidst the silence of the forest, accompanied only by the music of flowing streams and birds, helped the students feel a spiritual connection with nature. They experienced firsthand the

energy and peace that come from stepping away from a hectic life and merging with the tranquility of nature.

Conclusion

After three days of intensive learning and unforgettable experiences, the Green Guard members departed from Nedumkayam with a firm commitment to follow a lifestyle that does not harm nature. The camp successfully nurtured a group of young environmental activists ready to love and protect the forest. Along with enjoying the beauty of the woods, every student who gained forest wisdom will now act as a guardian of nature in society. This second three-day camp organized by the NGC for Malappuram district students was a resounding success.

REPORT THEMATIC CAMPAIGNS

Introduction

Thematic Campaigns are organized with the objective of creating environmental awareness and promoting social responsibility among school students and the general public. These campaigns provide a platform for students to actively participate in community-based environmental conservation activities. By engaging in practical and meaningful initiatives, students develop a sense of responsibility towards nature and society while contributing positively to their surroundings.

The campaigns focus on various environmental and social themes and encourage maximum participation from students, teachers, local communities, and the public. Through these activities, students gain firsthand experience in environmental protection, teamwork, leadership, and community service.

Objectives

The major objectives of the Thematic Campaigns are:

- To create awareness about environmental conservation and sustainable living.
- To encourage active participation of students in community service.
- To promote cleanliness and hygiene in public spaces.
- To develop a sense of environmental stewardship among young people.
- To strengthen the relationship between schools and local communities.
- To inspire collective action for protecting natural resources and biodiversity.

Activities Conducted

A variety of awareness and action-oriented activities were organized as part of the campaign.

Beach Cleaning Program

Students actively participated in cleaning nearby beaches by collecting plastic waste, discarded materials, and other pollutants. The activity highlighted the importance of maintaining clean coastal ecosystems and reducing marine pollution. Students learned about the harmful effects of plastic waste on marine life and the environment.

River and Pond Cleaning

Cleaning drives were conducted in rivers, ponds, and other water bodies to remove waste and improve environmental conditions. These activities emphasized the need to protect freshwater resources and maintain ecological balance. Students also interacted with local residents to spread awareness about preventing water pollution.

Cleaning of Public Places

Public spaces such as parks, roadsides, bus stops, and community areas were cleaned by student volunteers. The initiative encouraged civic responsibility and demonstrated the importance of maintaining cleanliness in shared spaces. Awareness messages on waste management and sanitation were also disseminated among the public.

Field Trips to Protected Areas

Educational field visits were organized to protected areas, wildlife habitats, and conservation sites. These visits provided students with opportunities to observe biodiversity, understand ecosystem

functions, and learn about conservation efforts. Experts and resource persons guided students during these visits, enriching their environmental knowledge.

Adoption of Protected Areas

Students participated in activities aimed at adopting and maintaining selected protected areas. Regular monitoring, cleanliness drives, awareness campaigns, and conservation activities were carried out to ensure the protection and upkeep of these locations. This initiative helped students develop a long-term commitment to environmental conservation.

Rallies and Awareness Marches

Awareness rallies were conducted to educate the public on environmental issues such as pollution control, waste management, water conservation, and biodiversity protection. Students carried placards, displayed banners, and delivered messages promoting environmental responsibility.

Street Plays and Cultural Programs

Street plays, skits, and cultural performances were organized to communicate environmental messages in an engaging and effective manner. These performances attracted public attention and helped spread awareness about environmental challenges and possible solutions.

As part of Environment Education Program “Thematic Campaign 2025” runs by Kerala State Council for Science Technology and Environment, Govt. of Kerala Ministry of Environment Forest and Climate Change, Govt. of India cleanup activities organised by National Green Corps of various districts at different coastal areas, rivers and ponds during the month of January-March 2026.

District Implementation and Monitoring Committees of various districts selected the major River banks, Beaches and Public ponds and were cleaned as part of this cleaning drive. About a thousand students from various NGC schools participated in this cleaning up drive and the drive witnessed voluntary participation of students, public representatives, officials, civil society organizations, clubs, etc.

The all team was equipped with all the necessary cleaning tools like gloves, rakes and sacks. The plastic wastes, water weeds and other non bio degradable solid wastes accumulated in the water bodies were collected and handed over to different waste management agencies. This program has also resulted in imparting to the students the very important message of serving and protecting the society and nature beyond the text book studies.

In addition, for promoting values of cleanliness, discipline and respect to our nature, we also organized awareness programme through public meeting, rallies and awareness classes to students. Through this we give awareness about importance of maintaining the water bodies clean.

ENVIRONMENT PROJECTS FOR SCHOOLS

(EEP School Projects)

Environment projects in schools not only benefit the environment but also contribute to the holistic development of students, promote community engagement, and create a more sustainable and healthy learning environment. Implementing environment projects in schools can have numerous benefits for both the school and the wider community. Environment projects help raise awareness about environmental issues and promote sustainable practices among students, teachers, and staff.

Engaging in environment projects provides students with hands on learning opportunities to apply classroom knowledge in real-world settings. These often involve collaboration with the local community, fostering partnerships and promoting a sense of civic responsibility.

Creating a sustainable environment in schools can lead to improved air quality, reduced waste, and a healthier learning environment for students and staff. Implementing energy and water conservation projects can lead to cost savings for the school, as well as teach students about the importance of resource efficiency.

Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate change sanctioned and released an amount 35 lakhs to Kerala State Council for Science, Technology and Environment for doing Environment Related Projects under Environment Education programme 2025-26.

The objective of the program is to release financial assistance to Ecoclub schools for doing Environment related projects with Ecoclub teacher as the coordinator and ecoclub volunteers as members

As part of this, Project proposals were invited from the actively participating Govt /Aided/ Unaided/Private schools registered under National Green Corps for doing Environment friendly projects with Ecoclub teacher as the PI of the project.

The proposed projects were under the following thematic areas:

- *Setting up of Medicinal /Biodiversity/ Medicinal/ Butterfly/ Vegetable gardens*
- *Setting up of Miawaki forests, Bamboosetum*
- *Mushroom cultivation*
- *LED bulb making workshop / Making Eco-friendly items*

- *Setting up of Millet cultivation and exhibition*
- *Setting up of Waste composting measures*
- *Awareness programmes/ plastic free campus*
- *Adoption of natural bodies/ apiculture/ kandal etc.*

Method of Implementation

Prepared Application forms and Guidelines for inviting proposals from schools. All NGC schools were informed to submit the proposals. Proposals were notified during last week of 10th October 2025 and the proposals received till 25th October were processed. A total of 457 applications received at KSCSTE.

An expert committee was constituted for the evaluation of proposals, with the approval of EVP, KSCSTE a meeting of the expert committee were held on 26th November 2025 at KSCSTE. The applications were scrutinised as per the guidelines issued by KSCSTE and 340 applications are recommended for providing financial assistance of Rs, 10,000/- each. The committee recommended releasing 80% of the sanctioned amount as advance to the schools and balance amount shall be released on submission of reports and SE/UC of the programme. The project was completed by February 2026. District wise breakup of the programme
