Fund disbursal:

MoEFCC sanctioned an amount Rs 2.43 cr. for financial year 2025-26 and released amount 2.27 cr. in two trenches. Proposal received from Ecoclub Schools and Colleges for various EEP activities including Sustainable lifestyle workshop, Campaign, Competition and Exhibition etc. The received amount is used for EEP activities through schools & colleges and programs conducted by IA through PFMS mode. The grant in aid is for the following purposes.

- A. Financial Assistance for organizing Sustainable Lifestyle Workshops/ Projects/ Exhibitions/ Campaigns/ Competitions as per the activities approved by the Ministry against the proposed activities by IAs. (a ceiling of Rs. 15 lakh per district)
- B. Financial assistance for organizing Nature Camps/ Summer Vacation Programmes (upto Rs. 40 lakh for twenty camps each of 50 students)

2. Background of EEP

The Environment Education Programme (EEP) is a component of the revamped Central Sector scheme ‘Environment Education, Awareness, Research and Skill Development (EEARSD)’ and it aims to supplement the efforts of Ministry of Education in the formal education front, through varied pedagogical initiatives to impart non-formal environment education. This programme intends to leverage on the key sectoral strength of Eco-clubs already formed under National Green Corps programme, in addition to targeting Youth Clubs and other such clubs/ units/ groups formed under various programmes/ schemes of the Government. The activities would be scaled up from symbolic ones to focused training/ campaigns on sustainable lifestyle aimed at motivating children/ youth to think critically and form their habits in such a way as to live in harmony with nature. Long-lasting change is most likely when it is self-motivated and rooted in positive thinking. The programme aims to supplement the knowledge that the children and young generation gain from classrooms with experience from nature and hands-on activities. Psychological interventions to behavior change like education, enablement, incentivization, modeling, persuasion, training, etc. would be the building blocks of this programme laid on the foundation of principles envisaged in the National Education Policy, 2020.

Objectives:

The objective of the Programme is to sensitize children/ youth, on issues related to environment and to motivate them to adopt sustainable lifestyle, through varied pedagogical initiatives like workshops, projects, exhibitions, campaigns, competitions, nature camps, summer vacation programmes, etc.

The IAs would organize “Sustainable Lifestyle Workshops/ Projects/ Exhibitions/ Campaigns/ Competitions/ Nature Camps/ Summer Vacation Programmes, etc.” for target beneficiaries. These workshops/ projects would give target beneficiaries a platform for developing scientific temper and critical thinking, display creativity and nurture values like compassion and empathy, in addition to strengthening of concepts and opportunity to experiment and experience sustainable



solutions, which use minimal resources, cause minimal pollution and generate minimal waste. Projects may also include impactful demonstration projects like solar solutions, waste management units, composting units, etc. Exhibitions are intended for display (and/or sale) of the eco-friendly products made by target beneficiaries to general public or a targeted audience so as to sensitize them and promote use of such products. Nature camps would help target beneficiaries to understand and appreciate India's unique natural diversity, varied ecosystems, flora and fauna, as well as to understand the threats to their survival. Thematic campaigns/ competitions like quiz, debate, essay, painting, physical activities, community participation, etc., would give target beneficiaries a platform for expressing their ideas and spreading their word to the public.

Expected Outcome:

Pro-environmental behavior or environmentally responsible behavior may be defined as the one that consciously seeks to minimize the negative impact of individual actions on the world. Individuals with such behavior have an inclination to adopt a sustainable lifestyle that has little impact on the environment and live in harmony with the nature. One can adopt a sustainable lifestyle by re-designing and re-structuring their day-to-day activities in such a way as to not burden the Earth's natural resources but supplement the efforts towards conservation and protection of the environment.

Several theoretical models have been evolved over the years to explain the factors that could bring about pro-environmental behavior. One of the oldest, simplest and most commonly used models of pro-environmental behavior is based on a linear progression of environmental knowledge leading to environmental awareness and attitudes, which in turn lead to pro-environmental behavior.

9. EPCO- Role of State Implementation Agency

EPCO has been appointed by the state Government as State Nodal Agency since inception of the scheme. In Madhya Pradesh, prior NGC scheme is being implemented in 13,000 schools and 100 Colleges in the state covering 52 districts with a view to provide an opportunity for children to redirect the consciousness and actions towards a more sustainable planet through a different way of educational approach and activities. Since 2022 the NGC scheme revamped and implemented as Environment Education Programme (EEP) which is un-doubted the most effective tool for the environmental education and conservation and implemented in 55 districts of M.P.

As a Implementation Agency (IA) of the state EPCO continuously engaged in inculcating understanding and appreciation for nature among student members of eco-club. This enabled them to develop future eco-pro citizen and facilitator of ecofriendly activities. School Education Department and Tribal Development Dept. of M.P. Govt. are active partners in implementation of the scheme. The quick and positive response/guidelines of Govt. of India at different stages have been an accelerating force for furtherance of the objective of scheme.





10. Administrative Support System for EEP in M.P

The State Steering Committee has already been formed under the chairmanship of Principal Secretary, Environment Department Govt. of Madhya Pradesh. Principal Secretary, School Education, Commissioner Public Instruction (CPI) and representatives of Forest Deptt, Health Deptt. Pollution Control Board and Executive Director, EPCO are its members. Representative of Tribal Department has also been associated with the state level committee. District level committees have also been constituted in all the districts of the state.

11. Inter-Departmental Coordination

It would have been quite difficult to implement EEP with eco-club schools spread over in the 55 districts of state without active co-operation of School Education department, Tribal Development department and district level field functionaries. We also received support from MP Eco-Development Board in district Anubhuti Programs and State Biodiversity Board during Mogli Bal utsav and Forest Deptt. During Van Mela.

The impact of coordinated efforts in implementation of the EEP scheme in state is gradually proceeding to achieve its aim of inculcating understanding/appreciation for environment among student members of eco-clubs so that they may act as;

- a. Strong medium for generating environmental awareness in society.
- b. Facilitator in eco-friendly activities.
- c. Future custodians of environment.

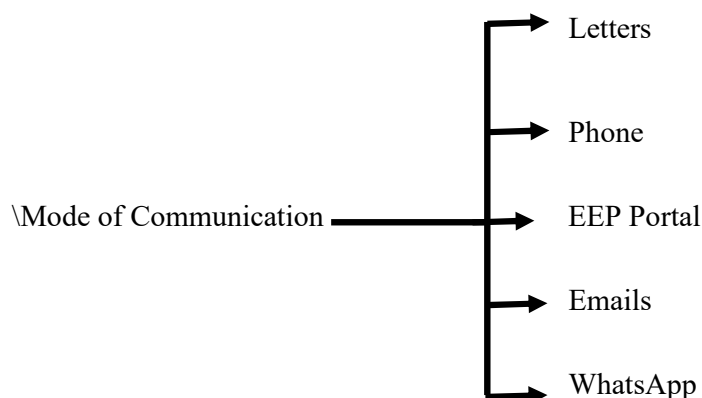


12. Monitoring, Evaluation & Communication:

The monitoring of program was conducted through three tier system. At first level all the communication and instruction received from Ministry of Environment is circulated for implementation and follow up to all District Education Officers (46 districts)/ Assistant Commissioners, Tribal Work Department (09 Districts) through emails, phones and WhatsApp groups. Every district has its WhatsApp group where all letters and important information were shared. EPCO issues letters to all District Education Officers (46 districts) / Assistant commissioners, Tribal Work Department (09 Districts) for further action and activities.

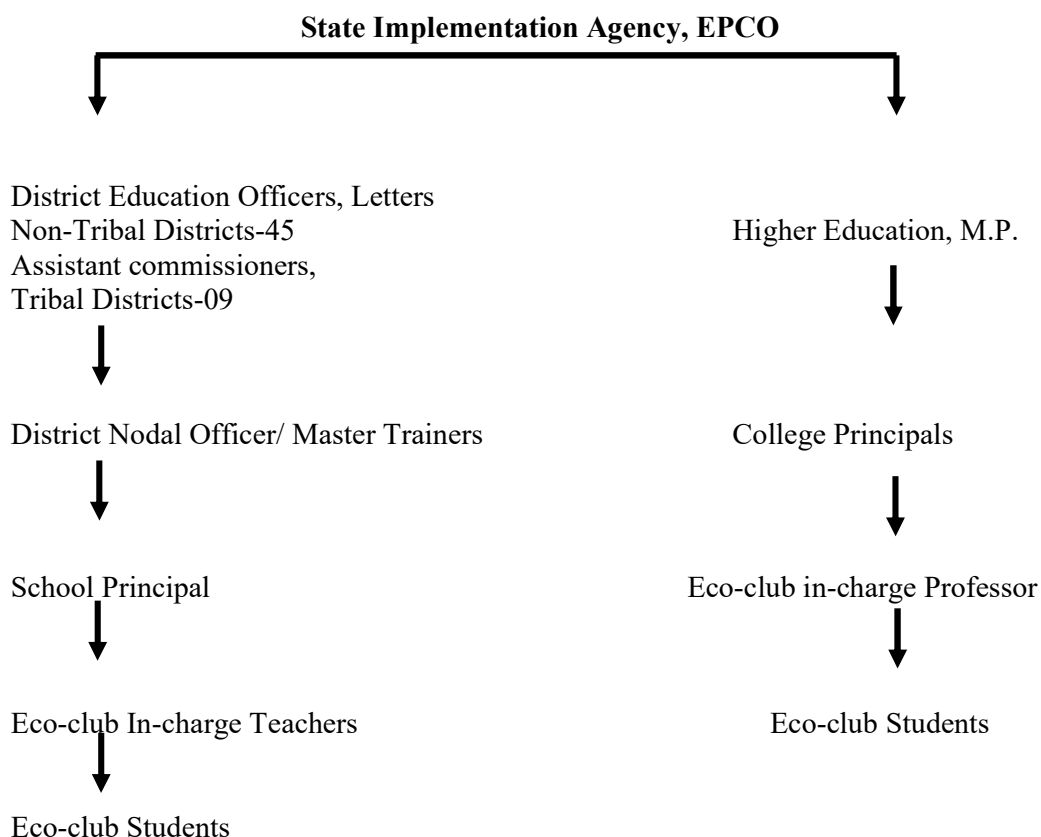

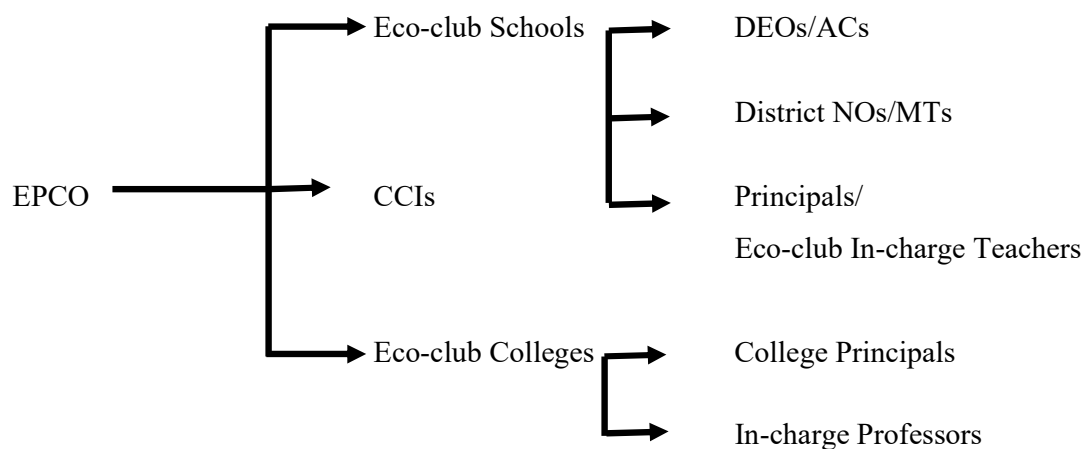




General flow of Monitoring, Evaluation and Communication System

13. State Level – Master Trainer & Quiz Master Training Program

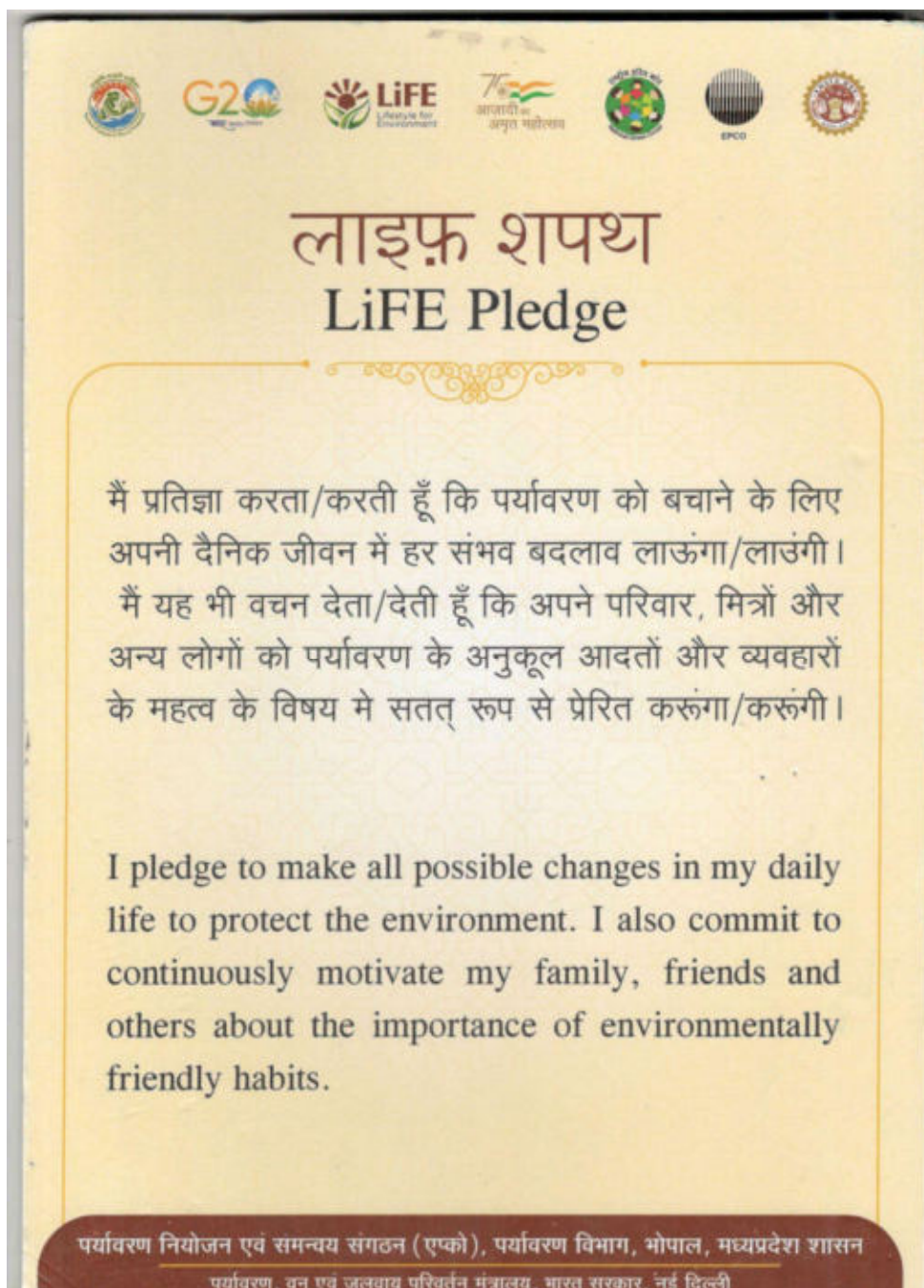
