To strengthen informal environmental education nationwide and foster a connection between young people and nature, the Government of India's Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change has transformed its Environment Education, Awareness and Training (EEAT) scheme into the Environment Education Programme (EEP). This program aims to educate young people about environmental issues and inspire them to adopt sustainable practices. It accomplishes this through engaging activities like capacity building, workshops, projects, exhibitions, campaigns, competitions, nature camps, and other awareness programs. As the State Implementing Agency, the Centre for Environmental Studies plays a leading role in implementing these initiatives, fostering an environmentally aware younger generation.

In the 2022-23 session, CES initially proposed a series of activities to the Ministry, including 10 exhibitions, 10 capacity building sessions, 20 nature camps, and 500 campaigns. Despite time constraints, all these activities were successfully carried out by the schools, colleges, and district authorities.

Again in the session 2023-24, we conducted 21 capacity building training programs, providing training to 1050 selected teachers. Additionally, we offered 4250 students the chance to participate in 85 nature camps and learning programs aimed at fostering an appreciation and love for nature. During these programs, students engaged in various activities such as trekking, bird watching, identifying plants, discovering the life cycles and habitats of animals, and more.


Eight exhibitions were organized across 8 districts, with 50 participants from different schools showcasing models on sustainable lifestyles across eleven themes, including energy conservation, water conservation, drip irrigation, waste reduction, elimination of single use plastic, swachhata for making healthy environment, medicinal plant gardening, establishing kitchen gardens or rooftop gardens, waste management, green belt development/plantation, vermin-composting, and adopting sustainable lifestyles.

Each exhibition involved 50 students and 50 guide teachers, attracting over 4000 students and members of the general public. These exhibitions effectively promoted sustainable lifestyles, generating positive enthusiasm and interest among visitors.

Capacity building programs for teachers focused on promoting sustainable lifestyles through skill-based or product-based training on relevant themes. Trained teachers were tasked with implementing these activities in their respective institutions. Remarkably, approximately 150 schools in each activity category demonstrated tangible results. Notably, nearly 120 schools successfully established vermin-composting pits, sharing their innovative ideas through practical demonstrations to inspire others. Some districts organized large-scale awareness campaigns through rallies and meetings.

Several schools enthusiastically engaged in developing mini nurseries, resulting in significant growth and development. Moreover, many schools successfully established kitchen or rooftop gardens, already reaping the benefits of these initiatives.

Despite the limited number of participating schools, the program received an overwhelming response. Plans are underway to expand the program in the next financial year, aiming to reach more schools and individuals, guiding and motivating them towards embracing a green, sustainable lifestyle. Gratitude is extended to everyone involved, including the Centre for Environmental Studies, district authorities, teachers, and students, for their collective efforts in promoting environmental awareness and mobilizing student participation in conservation efforts, thus refining and perfecting the program.

## ENVIRONMENT EDUCATION PROGRAMME (EEP)

In accordance with the newly launched Environment Education Programme (EEP) under the revised scheme of the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change (MoEF&CC), Government of India, the Centre for Environmental Studies (CES), under the Forest, Environment & Climate Change Department of the Government of Odisha, has been designated as the Implementing Agency (IA) for conducting activities under EEP, acting as the State Nodal Agency (SNA) for the National Green Corps (NGC) Programme.

As part of the Ministry's new program design, CES planned for organizing various activities, including 21 Capacity Building Programs (covering 13 districts), 04 District-level exhibitions (covering 4 districts), 85 Nature Camps (covering all districts), and 4000 campaigns through eco-clubs looking into the comfortable participation of eco-clubs in short period time left out in the financial year 2023-24.

## REGISTRATION IN EEP PORTAL


Registration in EEP Portal under the Environment Education Programme (EEP) of the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change (MoEF&CC), Government of India, the Centre for Environmental Studies (CES) in the Forest, Environment & Climate Change Department, Government of Odisha, has been assigned to function as the Implementing Agency (IA) for conducting various activities under EEP.

As part of this program, the Government of India through MoEF&CC has launched a portal for the EEP program, in which all state implementing agencies were instructed to circulate the message among all eco-clubs to register themselves on this portal.

In Odisha, there are 15,250 eco-clubs established by both the Government of Odisha and the Government of India. CES has requested all eco-clubs functioning in the state to register on the portal. The Ministry aimed



for 12,500 eco-clubs to be registered on the portal. However, registration has surpassed the 100% target, reaching 12,521 within a short duration, and registration is still ongoing by other schools and colleges. This achievement is unique in the country. From time to time, MoEF&CC shares the status report of registration.

This has been achieved due to continuous effort of CES by encouraging schools & colleges through regular message by WhatsApp, Telegram, Email directly and also through District Education Officers and Mo School Abhijan Parichalana Sangathan Office.



## ONLINE TRAINING

More than 20 online sessions were conducted since 15th September 2023 to 31.03.2024 to provide hands on training on "How to Register in EEP Website", "Uploading Activity Information", and "Sharing Practical Knowledge on how to conduct", "Theme based activities for visible outcomes" on regular intervals. In each session more than 300 teachers participated

## CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAMME ON SUSTAINABLE LIFESTYLE

From 13 selected districts, 21 Capacity Building program was conducted covering 10 themes, with 50 teachers from the respective districts namely Anugul, Bolangir, Boudh, Cuttack, Dhenkanal, Khordha, Ganjam, Jajpur, Kendrapada, Keonjhar, Nayagarh, Nuapada, and Puri participating. For each theme, program were conducted in each district inviting 50 selected teachers. The themes covered included "Elimination of Single-Use Plastics", "Energy Conservation", "Development of Kitchen/ Rooftop Garden", "Nursery Raising", "Medicinal Garden", "Plantation Technique", "Water Conservation", "Swachhta", "Waste Management" and "Vermi-Composting". One Capacity Building programs were organized for each specific theme. 1050 teachers from 13 districts have been trained in 21 Capacity Building programs. There was also media coverage in the State Dailies. Guide books on respective themes were compiled and distributed among participants.

During the Capacity Building programs, teachers were fully trained with practical exercises and the schools have been assigned to conduct their Campaigns on the concerned themes. Experts from State Implementing Agency and invited local subject experts imparted the trainings. The Office of the District Education Officers, District Science Supervisors and Divisional Forest Offices of concerned districts extended their full cooperation in organizing the programs. Required resource materials on concerned themes have been distributed among teachers for their guidance in carrying out their activities. Certificates of completion of Master Trainer training were distributed among all teachers in these programs.

## EXHIBITION OF MODELS/ PRODUCTS FOR PROMOTING SUSTAINABLE LIFESTYLE

Similarly, eight nos of District level exhibitions were organized in Jajpur, Khordha, Boudh, Kendrapara, Koraput, Sonepur & Puri districts. In one exhibition, 50 selected school students along with their guide teachers were invited from concerned districts to exhibit their models/ products related to Sustainable Lifestyles on 10 themes namely "Elimination of Single-Use Plastics", "Energy Conservation", "Development of Kitchen/ Rooftop Garden", "Nursery Raising", "Medicinal Garden", "Plantation Technique", "Water Conservation", "Swachhta", "Waste Management" and "Vermi-Composting". Winners were awarded. In total, 400 students exhibited their models/ products and more than 4000 people visited the exhibitions. The activities were also in the State Dailies. Best 3 Winners in each Exhibition were awarded with certificates & cash prizes in the concerned programs.

## NATURE CAMP PROGRAMME

Under Environment Education Programme (EEP) of Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change, Government of India, 85 Nature Camps have been organized in the State covering eco-club students of 28 districts. In each Camp 50 students & guide teachers were invited. Students learned about nature and its care while doing different activities in the nature sites. Experts trained the students by involving them in different activities such as making some articles from tree leaves, painting, group discussion, debate, identify plants and animals & study of their lifestyles, making eco-friendly products, bio-diversity register, bird watching, art using plant leaves, trained on how forest fire is extinguished, how to study age of trees, study animal habitats etc. Total 4250 students were benefitted in these Nature Camps.
