Introduction:

The Environment Education Programme (EEP) is a component of the revamped Central Sector Scheme, 'Environment Education, Awareness, Research and Skill Development (EEAESD)' and it aims to supplement the efforts of the Ministry of Education in the formal education front, through varied academic initiatives to impart non-formal environment education. The objective of this Programme is to sensitize children/youth, on issues related to the environment and to motivate them to adopt a sustainable lifestyle, through varied pedagogical initiatives like workshops, projects, exhibitions, campaigns, competitions, nature camps, summer vacation programmes, etc. the activities envisaged are aimed to motivating children/youth to think critically and form their habits in such a way as to live in harmony with nature.

Accordingly, the Implementing Agency (IA) Nagaland Pollution Control Board, organized various activities like Sustainable Lifestyle Workshops, Exhibitions, Competitions, and Nature Camps to the target beneficiaries. The Sustainable Lifestyle Workshop would give target beneficiaries a platform for developing scientific temper and critical thinking, displaying creativity and nurturing values like compassion and empathy, in addition to strengthening concepts and opportunities to experiment and experience sustainable solutions, which use minimal resources, cause minimal pollution and generate minimal waste. Exhibitions are intended for the display (and/or sale) of eco-friendly products made by target beneficiaries to the general public or audience to sensitize them and promote the use of such products. Nature camps would help target beneficiaries to understand and appreciate India's unique natural diversity, varied ecosystems, flora, and fauna, as well as to understand the threats to their survival. Thematic competitions like quizzes, debates, essays, painting, physical activities, community participation, etc. would give target beneficiaries a platform for expressing their ideas and spreading their word to the public. The initiatives would be synergized with the Prime Minister's Lifestyle for Environment (LiFE) mission.

1. Sustainable Lifestyle Workshops:

SustainableLifestyles are considered as ways of living, social behaviors, and choices, that minimize environmental degradation (use of natural resources, CO2 emissions, waste, and pollution) while supporting equitable socio-economic development and better quality of life for all. It also means understanding how our lifestyle choices impact the world around us and finding ways for everyone to live better and lighter. Sustainable Lifestyle Workshops on various topics such as Bamboo crafts and basket weaving, Banana Fiber weaving, and woodcraft workshops, creating rainwater harvesting infrastructure in homes/schools/offices, and practicing segregation of dry and wet wastes at homes were organized by the Implementing Agency Nagaland Pollution Control Board. 3. Competitions :

Competitions based on important environmental days such as the Wetlands Day were conducted for the students. 4. Nature Camps:

The objective of the Nature camp was to provide participants with an opportunity to disconnect from the hustle and bustle of daily life, and engage themselves in nature and outdoor recreational activities The camp aimed to provide students with an immersive experience in the pristine wilderness of nature, focusing on environmental education, biodiversity exploration, and fostering a sense of control towards nature among the participating students. It also aimed to expose students to the rich biodiversity and ecological significance of nature, educate them about environmental conservation practices and sustainable living, and promote hands-on learning experiences in natural settings to cultivate a deeper connection with the environment. The purpose of the camp was also to make the students learn about the importance of Nature and natural resources and to instill concern about the importance of the various flora and fauna in the forest and how they co-exist together in harmony. Students embarked on guided hikes through the lush forests and scenic trails of the Western side of the famous Dzükou Valley, accompanied by a knowledgeable guide who provided insights into the local flora and fauna. Some of the students also collected the waste along the trekking trail of Khonoma Dzukou and also in Dzulekie. The camp also provided an immersive experience in the pristine natural surroundings of Dzüleke and Sheep Farm at Poilwa, Peren District, allowing students to connect with nature and learn about biodiversity conservation. The camping trip also had a reflection session where students shared their thoughts and experiences. The camp emphasized the importance of preserving fragile ecosystems and encouraged students to be more aware of environmental management in their communities. Overall, the Nature Camp provided an enriching experience for college students, empowering them to take proactive steps towards protecting the environment and fostering a culture of sustainability. The nature camp was a resounding success, providing students with a transformative learning experience, and instilling in them a sense of responsibility towards environmental conservation and sustainable living practices.

During the camping trip, a variety of activities were organized to provide the diverse interests of the participants. These activities included:

- Hiking: Participants set about on scenic hikes along designated trails, exploring the natural beauty of the surrounding area and enjoying beautiful views of the landscape.
- Nature Walks: Guided nature walks were conducted to introduce participants to the local flora and fauna, highlighting the ecological significance of the region.

This exhibition will create awareness and also help the students to be aware of the positive impacts by practicing small alternatives to reduce plastic waste and help them to learn the importance of eco-friendly alternatives.

D. Nature camp on Wildlife Week and International Mountain Day:

- ii) 7 nature camps on the above theme will be conducted across the state giving exposure to 350 students from 16 districts.
- iii) The expenditure proposed for conducting seven (7) nature camps across the state will be 7 nos. x ₹ 200,000/- = ₹ 1,400,000/-
